Curiously, the book of Leviticus starts with its first word's last letter - *aleph* - written noticeably smaller. The *Ba'al Turim* commentary suggests the reason points to Moses' humility. Moses, our teacher, was a humble man. The commentary explains that Moses wanted the first word of the Book of Leviticus to read: *vayi<u>kar</u>*, instead of *vayi<u>kra</u>. Vayikar* means by chance - by chance, God spoke to Moses. *Vayikra* means called - The Lord called to Moses. Out of humility, Moses downplays his personal relationship with God, and out of deference to Moses, the last letter of the first word is written noticeably smaller. It was important to Moses that others not think he was more special than anyone else in the presence of God.
