Traveling through Poland gives us an opportunity to visit historic sites of culture, to engage in meetings with members of the Jewish Community, and of course to explore and experience the remnants of the camps, ghettos and the painful reality of the Shoah. The cobblestoned Old Cities of Warsaw and ancient castles of Krakow offer a stark comparison to the unthinkable tragedy of the Holocaust. Prague's history of the Jews is one of Central Europe's oldest and most well-known. Prague boasts one of the oldest recorded kehilot in Europe. Then we learn about Berlin's modern-day Jewish community in a bustling kosher café, and hear stories about the city's earliest Jewish citizens as you visit the site of the demolished 18th-century Old Synagogue and the elegant 19th-century New Synagogue, an architectural landmark.
