This week's Torah portion, *Naso*, contains a series of laws that seem to have little in common with each other. Laws dealing with Israelites excluded from the camp due to ritual impurity are cited. Laws governing the Priest's acceptance of offerings given to him by confessed robbers, along with laws that deal with a woman accused by her husband of having committed adultery are listed. All of these laws seem to have no thematic connection -- or do they? Understood together, these laws form the basis of a community that strives toward the holy. These are "ordinary" laws, but God's power is found in the ordinary. The sacred is never removed from the ordinary. God resides in the details of the day-to-day; God's presence on earth is magnified by our commitment to those details.
