PARASHAT NITSAVIM

This morning's Torah portion is the last one read for the year. Its content prepares us for the spiritual message of the High Holidays. "For this commandment which I command you this day, is not too hard for you, neither is it far off." (Deut. 30:11) The question becomes, what is not too hard? Most commentators believe the verse refers to *t'shuvah*, repentance. The problem is that repentance is not easy. It is very difficult to admit you're wrong, to own up to your failures. That is why we have days "earmarked" for repentance. But when you look at the community assembled on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, a community that shares similar wrongdoings and failures, engaging in repentance becomes much easier. With the strength, understanding and comfort we can get from one another, let us be assured repentance is within reach of us all.
