PARASHAT NOAH


There are so many different languages in the world, being able to speak more than one is a blessing. Ironically, the Bible doesn't view it that way. It sees the variety of languages spoken around the world as a punishment for having built the Tower of Babel. The Torah cites the motivation for the tower's construction as "making a name for ourselves" (Gen. 11:4). That's the tragedy of the Tower of Babel. It's not that the world ended up multi-lingual, but that communication ceased between human beings, the result of one's own personal preoccupation (making a name for oneself). When we set out to make a "name for ourselves" there is little room for dialogue. On the other hand, when we set out to elevate God's presence in the world, the point of reference changes to things beyond oneself. The result is that communication flourishes between all peoples!


