We're a welcoming community where you don't get lost; your face is known to many and you know many faces.



Rabbi Michael Gotlieb has been our spiritual leader at KM since 1995. He was ordained at the Jewish Theological Seminary in 1990 where he also earned his Masters Degree in Jewish Studies. He completed his rabbinic internship at Columbia University. Before coming to KM, he served a congregation in North County San Diego for 5 years.

In addition to his congregational activities, Rabbi Gotlieb has served as president of the Rabbinical Assembly Southwest Region and is a member of the Southern California Board of Rabbis. He also volunteers at Santa Monica College Hillel and St. John's Hospital and is on the board of Israel's Schechter Institute.



ur learning opportunities are for every generation of our community:

Early Childhood: Our little ones ignite their joy for Judaism and build a positive connection to Jewish community and identity through programs that create an environment of educational play.

Religious School: Our K-9th grade students gain a deep understanding of their Jewish identity by studying culture, music, Torah, history and Hebrew in our fully accredited Builders of Jewish Education (BJE) Religious School.

ur worship services are the perfect combination of traditional and progressive:

Friday Night / Kabbalat Shabbat: Join us to welcome with joy and new energy the beginning of Shabbat. Sing Kabbalat Shabbat with piano accompaniment (before the Barchu). Pray with traditional and new readings. And share a little nosh (so you can have dinner before or after). First Friday of each month at 6pm.

Saturday Morning / Shabbat: Enjoy a full traditional, but egalitarian, service. Participate in a lively Torah discussion and maybe even lead portions of the service, chant a Haftarah or provide a scholarly discourse. Also, we honor our B'nai Mitzvah of all ages with the opportunity to lead services. Every Saturday at 10am.

Take part in opportunities to extend the Shabbat experience beyond the synagogue. A Kiddush is a wonderful opportunity to get to know the members of the congregation and our Rabbi and Cantor on a more intimate level. Other gatherings have included potluck Seudah Shlishit (third meal), Study Sessions and Shabbat Study Groups.

Social Action: Support various projects that help those in need throughout the global, national, and local community.



Our Philosophy

Our philosophy is to get the students up and out of their seats because through creative, interactive experiences, positive Jewish memories are cemented. Each student will grow to understand and appreciate their religion, culture and place within our larger Jewish community.

There are no books—instead, students immerse themselves in technology, computers, learning stations, games, singing, film, art and other interactive learning modalities.

They learn the prayers and why we pray, not just rote memorization. They go on adventures to learn history, create art to connect with Torah, and dissect and discuss just about everything. They're active, engaged participants in their learning journey that goes at their own pace.

Our Upper School (2nd-9th) program is headed by Director of Education Sharone Weizman, who worked for synagogues on the East Coast before returning to California where she had graduated from American Jewish University with a Master's in Jewish Education and Bachelor's in Jewish Studies and Hebrew Literature.

Masha Savitz Keys, Head of Early Childhood & Arts, leads our Lower School (K-1) program. Years ago, she thought she wanted to become a Rabbi, but when she went to rabbinical school, she decided she was more of an artist. At Kehillat Ma'arav, she's been able to seamlessly blend these two passions.

Our staff also includes incredible teaching professionals who have huge hearts and the ability to connect with students and their families.
