# My Mama's Best Ever Hamantaschen

Prep Time: 5 mins + 2 hours chill time

**Cook Time: 15 minutes** 

**Total Time: 31 minute** 

**Yield: About 2 dozen cookies** 

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1/2 cup softened butter (can likely use vegan butter too)

Jam/filling of choice: I used raspberry sumo orange – so good!)

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 teaspoons baking powder

2 cups flour

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

In a large bowl, cream together the butter and sugar with a mixer until combined

Add in the eggs, orange juice and vanilla extract and mix again until fully combined

Mix in the baking powder and flour to form the dough

Form the dough into a thick circle and wrap it in plastic wrap and add to fridge for at least 2 hours (or overnight)

Preheat oven to 375 degrees and line 2-3 baking sheets with parchment paper

Roll the chilled dough onto a lightly floured surface to about 1/8 inch thick

Cut out circles about 3 inches in diameter (I used a large drinking glass)

Place a teaspoon of filling into the center of each circle

Fold up the edges to form a triangle and pinch together edges firmly

Add to the baking sheet and bake in oven for 12-15 minutes

Allow the cookies to cool for a few then enjoy!

# NORMAN T. GOTTLIEB Remembered by Karen Gottlieb



My father, Norman T. Gottlieb was born in Brooklyn, New York in 1914, to Anna and Joseph Gottlieb. He attended Boys High School, New York University (from which he graduated in three years) and Howard University Medical School, a black university, during a time when Jews were not being accepted to white medical schools. For many years he lived next door to Jennie and Rubin Eckstein, and their daughters Sarah and Miriam, and developed a budding love for Sarah who he eventually married. He was father to me and my brother, Kenneth.

Norman Gottlieb was an officer and a gentleman. He served in the army in Morocco, played violin in the Doctors Symphony Orchestra, attended opera, symphonic concerts and theater, read numerous medical journals, participated in groups supporting young opera singers, and even sang with the Verdi Chorus in Santa Monica. Above all, he was a well-respected and notable internist, a lifetime pursuit he enjoyed until poor health forced him into retirement. I was surprised to learn that one of my brother's childhood friends pursued a medical career because he wanted to emulate my Dad.

Despite his demanding practice, he always had time for his children, reading and editing my term papers, recounting the plot of the opera he was going to attend, complete with snippets of arias, chastising me for trying to cancel a date with one gentleman when another whom I preferred called, and making sure my spoken and written English was always impeccable. It is from my Dad that I gained my love for music, and learned honesty, kindness, respect and integrity.

My father died on April 5, 2000, five days before my birthday. The pain was unbearable. To this day, with every endeavor, I hope that I am making him proud. I am so grateful to have been raised by this intellectually curious, charismatic, warm, loving, and caring man.
