

LET'S EAT!

Bialy Hamantaschen

INGREDIENTS:

Bialy Dough

½ teaspoon instant yeast

1 teaspoon granulated sugar

2 cups bread flour (or all-purpose flour, plus up to 1-2 tablespoons more)

1 teaspoon salt

¾ cup room temperature water

1 teaspoon oil, 1 used grapeseed oil

Bialy Filling

½ cups diced white onions, (1 large onion)

1 tablespoon oil, 1 used grapeseed oil

¼ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon poppy seeds

Assembly

1 egg

4 ounces cream cheese (½ block)

DIRECTIONS:

1. First make your bialy dough. Whisk together the yeast, sugar and flour in a large bowl. Then add salt and whisk to combine. Then gradually add the water and mix with a wooden spoon or your hands until combined. Knead for 10 minutes until the dough is soft and smooth. It should be a little tacky, but if it's very sticky add a little more flour 1 tablespoon at a time. You can also use a stand mixer with a dough hook here.

2. Coat dough in a tiny bit of oil and place in the bowl. Cover and let rise in a warm place for 1.5 hours.

3. While your dough is rising, make the filling! Spoon 14 1-teaspoon balls of cream cheese onto a plate and place in the freezer. The cream cheese is easier to handle frozen, which is why we do this.

4. Then, caramelize your onions. Heat a sauté pan over medium heat and add oil. Once oil is hot, add diced onions and ¼ teaspoon salt and lower heat to medium-low. Sauté for 15 minutes or until the onions are cooked through and golden in color, careful not to let the onions burn.

5. Remove the onions into a bowl and let cool. Mix with poppy seeds and set aside.

6. When your dough is ready, punch it down and roll out between ¼ and ⅛ inch thick. If your dough is bouncing back a lot, let it rest a few moments and roll again.

Use a 3-inch (or 3.5 inch if that's what you have) cookie cutter to cut 12-14 circles in the dough, re-rolling out the scraps. Place them on a parchment lined baking sheet and cover with a towel and let dough rest 30 minutes.

Pre-heat oven to 450 degrees F.

7. Make an egg wash by whisking the egg together with 1 tablespoon water.

8. Take one circle at a time and roll or press it down so it's ⅛ thick. Brush the circle with egg wash and top with one cream cheese ball and ½ teaspoon onion mixture. Fold up three sides and pinch together very well so they are secure. Repeat with the other circles.

9. Place hamantaschen on the parchment-lined baking sheet 1-inch apart and freeze for 10 minutes to prevent spreading. Brush again with egg wash, focusing on where the edges meet.

10. Bake for 7 minutes or until the bottoms are golden brown.

Cool slightly on a cooling rack, though these are really good warm from the oven or popped in the microwave for 10 seconds or a warm oven for a minute.

IN MEMORY OF:

Shmil Fikhman *Remembered by Diana Volman*

When an email came from the Temple and I was asked to write about my father, I hesitated. I love him beyond any words but to write about his fate seemed impossible. No one would believe that a person who endured everything he did could remain warm, kind and able to make good jokes.

My father was born in the small town of Telenesti in Bessarabia in 1928. His family owned some land and a few cows which during Stalin's regime qualified them as "kulaks". One night he was arrested and deported to Siberia. At 21 he was named an "enemy of the people" and placed at the labor camp where he had to load heavy lumber on railroad cars. After 2 years of these inhuman conditions he got the permission to study. He traveled to Ulan-Ude, the capital city of Buryatia, not far from Lake Baikal, and entered the University to study veterinary medicine. Upon graduation, after Stalin's death, he was allowed to go back to Moldova and work at collective farm. He got married and had 2 children. He worked very hard and made life for us comfortable. One day when I was 12 years old the letter from America came. It was from his distant cousin. The local authorities considered that "connection with the West" suspicious. He was framed and put to prison for 8 years. He returned at the day of my wedding.

In 1990 we were allowed to immigrate to America. Those were better years for my father. He worked as a caregiver to an older Jewish man, they became good friends... In 2004 my father was a passenger in the car that got into severe accident. He became handicapped and never recovered from the injuries. He lived for another 10 years and I never heard him complain until the very last day.

In spite of such fate my father remained loving and good-natured. Somehow he was able to preserve his dignity. I admire my father.
